

CPAG Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is the music Christian, Gospel, Religious, etc.?

A: Although the concerts are held at Mariner United Methodist Church, CPAG concerts and performers are not selected or controlled by the church. We choose performers who provide clean, family-friendly shows that appeal to a wide audience.

Q: Do I have to be a member of Mariner UMC to attend?

A: We welcome everyone from the community to attend our concerts. After all, our name includes the word Community!

Q: What does CPAG do with the money from the tickets?

A: CPAG is a non-funded, self-sustaining, not-for-profit, all volunteer organization. None of the volunteers are paid for the work they perform. Most of the proceeds are used to pay the performers and for supplies, printing, rental of the facility, etc. Any money beyond these needs is donated to worthy local charitable causes at the end of each season.

Q: If I want to order tickets through the website, do I need a PayPal account?

A: No. PayPal provides a secure payment portal to process our credit or debit transactions, but [you don't need a PayPal account to use this service](#). You can pay with Visa, Mastercard, Discover, or American Express [and be confident that the payment is secure!](#)

Q: Can I buy tickets for individual concerts?

A: We need to know how many people will attend the entire season of concerts so we know how much we can spend on booking the performers each season. For this reason, we sell only season tickets initially. Shortly before each concert we will evaluate how many seats are still left, and may make individual tickets available. In such cases, single tickets will be \$20 each. Only season ticket holders will be eligible for most special giveaways or drawings.

Q: Are our tickets for specific reserved seats?

A: The tickets are general admission. Seating is on a first come, first served basis. Doors open an hour before showtime. We do ask that early arrivers not hold seats for several later arriving attendees. It's OK to hold for one or two while they park or stop by the restroom, but not for an entire group. We hope everyone will understand our desire for fairness in this matter.
